WHO OR WHAT IS A VOCATIONAL DEACON?

Since New Testament times, the Church has recognized three distinct orders of ordained ministry: Bishops, Priests and Deacons. For many years, the distinct order of the diaconate (Vocational Deacon) was ignored by our churches. It is only in recent years that our diocese, along with others in the Anglican Church of Canada, has re-introduced and recognized the important work of the Vocational Deacon.

Those called to the priesthood are first ordained deacon but the title of deacon within that order has always been considered "Transitional" rather than permanent. When we speak of "Vocational Deacons" we are recognizing that certain individuals are called not to become priests but to retain the title of deacon because of the specific work that they undertake in our parishes.

Canon Martha has recognized that there are some individuals at St George's who are likely called to the office of deacon in our midst. These individuals are already working within the community as representatives of our parish in areas of outreach where their vision and gifts are being used in very valuable ways. Over the coming weeks, I will be interviewing three people all of whom are in one way or another interested in becoming Deacons at St George's.



You will hear more about him and from him next week when he preaches at our main Sunday morning service. The other two individuals are MJ Schmidt and Anita Djurkovic, both of whom are already familiar to most of us and are still discerning their call to this type of ordained ministry.
